

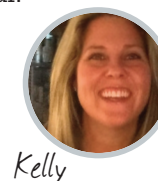

Trinity's mission statement calls us to reach both near and far. With the gifts that God has entrusted us, God calls us to love and serve our brothers and sisters not only locally but in the world. We have partners and other organizations that share a common mission and purpose and with whom we can do far more than we could on our own. Our commitment includes sharing resources and building relationships with these five core values: kinship, transformative, relational, foundational and sustainable.

The Global Water Center's Mobile Discovery Center

Volunteer to support this fascinating exhibit coming to Minnesota!

Water Mission, which is described below is an organization that installs safe drinking water systems in communities in need. The Water Mission founders have realized that their efforts, combined with others, are not achieving enough to reduce water poverty. Therefore, they formed the **Global Water Center** to coordinate the efforts of the global community to eradicate water poverty. There are over 2,200,000,000 people around the world who do not have access to safe drinking water. As a result, over 2,300 people die each day of water borne disease, mostly children.

We invite our Trinity congregation to come and visit the GWC's Mobile Discovery Center to learn about this global problem and to discover how it can be solved. This is a fascinating, high technology, educational exhibit that is great for the whole family. It will be in the **Southdale Shopping Center** parking lot from **September 8-12** and will be open from **10am to 7pm** most days. Walk for Water | Sept 25, 9am



Trinity is again sponsoring an inspiring event in support of **Water Mission**, a Christian based organization. For several years, our Trinity team has grown as we raise awareness of the global water poverty crisis. We will "Walk for Water" at the Upper Landing Park in Saint Paul, walking about 3 miles to simulate the daily routine of over a billion people worldwide. The funds we have raised have gone to build sustainable safe drinking water systems in Kenya, Tanzania, Haiti and Honduras. By doing so, we help save lives.

Julie and Steve Vanderboom are sponsors of this walk and have committed to covering the registration costs of Team Trinity. Part of the trip will include greetings from El Salvador including Bishop Gomez, pastoral leadership from each of the Salvadoran communities and from students and their families.

Opportunity International Columbia Update

The pandemic has impacted people living in poverty hard. 6.3 million people have been pushed into poverty or further into poverty. These past 18 months, food distribution has been the primary focus by Opportunity.

The project Trinity helps support, an Opportunity Zone, is just in the early stages. The goal will be to increase incomes, create and sustain jobs, and provide an affordable quality education for children and youth that leads to a job, starting a business or going to college. Focuses include AgFinance, EduFinance, and Graduation and Savings Groups program. We will continue to update the congregation on this project as well as some events.

Monthly Community Meals



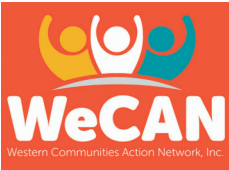

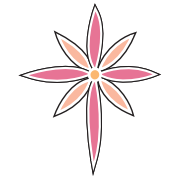
