

this moment. these people.

My wife, Kayla, and I have a joke that whenever we go to an event with lots of people or anywhere you might end up having to wait in line, whatever line I pick, pick the other one. I always overthink it. Probably because I hate waiting in line so much that I analyze way more than I should. And what do I get? Always the one that is maddeningly slow. I probably deserve it.

I hate waiting in line. I hate waiting for anything, really. If I have a package coming in the mail, a vacation on the calendar, or I hit that inevitable traffic jam on 494 in the middle of the day on a Tuesday – I hate waiting. I think it mostly has to do with the idea I've created in my head of what I'm missing out on by waiting. I might miss a homerun waiting for a hot dog or miss out on an extra half hour with friends while I'm bumperto-bumper on the highway.

Waiting also means I have to slow down; I'm forced to be present with my own thoughts or the people I'm with instead of the idea of what's to come. And truthfully, that's one of the hardest things in the world for me. It also might be the thing I need the most.

When Jesus made himself known to his disciples after his death and resurrection, one of the last things he told them before he ascended into heaven was to stay in Jerusalem and *wait* for the promise of the Father. Rather than telling them all the active things they must *do*, he told them to wait for the promise of God to be revealed to them, to wait for God to act.

This kind of waiting, as Andy Root and Blair Bertrand write in their new book *When Church Stops Working*, is called **resonance**. "*Resonance is both the action of seeking connections and the result of that seeking. It is a way of being in the world that stays in the present because it doesn't get distracted by the future of more...Resonance is action that awaits arrival...it acts to receive, to wait for what is uncontrollable.*" And so, they argue, "*we wait for what is uncontrollable by attending to this moment with these people.*"

What, then, does *waiting* look like at Trinity? What are the ways we can more fully attend to *this moment with these people* so that we might encounter God anew and the way God is revealing God's self in this place?

We are a people gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, called to wait in wonder of the God who acts in beautiful and mysterious ways. This kind of resonant waiting might be difficult, but I think it might be exactly what we need the most.



music ministry ensembles

Music Ensembles are back in full force come September. Trinity has a long tradition of strong and engaged music ensembles that encourage all ages to join in

creating music for worship and celebration. All the music ensembles are open to everyone, no auditions or requirements. If you cannot make it every week, we can work around that as well. **Please contact Mark if you have questions or interest in any of these opportunities; people can join at anytime.**

Vocal Choirs

Youth Choir – This ensemble is open to students K-5, **meets Wednesdays 4-5pm**, sings in worship one Sunday each month. The singers will explore their voices, ensemble singing, musical elements, small group activities, and the joy of music. Bus transportation is available from the Orono Schools. Register through the Trinity Kids Registration.

Middle School Choir – We have taken a couple years off, but back to singing this Fall! This choral group is open to all students 6-8th grade, **meets Wednesdays 5:30-6pm**, and will assist with Wednesday Night Worship on occasion and Sunday Morning worship as available.

Trinity Choir – Our adult choral ensemble rehearses Wednesdays 6:45-7:30pm, and sings in Sunday worship 2-3 Sundays each month. We explore a wide variety of music from classic to contemporary! You don't have to be a soloist or read music to sing with this ensemble, we invite all to join in singing God's praise, and spend time with some really great people. This is the primary ensemble for our annual *Worship Concert* on **November 26**; a wonderful opportunity to sing with a 25-piece orchestra and professional soloists.

Hand Bells

Chancel Bells – This is our advance adult bell choir which rehearses Mondays 6-7:30pm and usually plays the second Sunday of each month, and Christmas Eve. Many from this group have been ringing more than 20 years, and ring with several ensembles. We play more advanced bell music, and prior ringing experience or music reading skills will help you enjoy this ensemble.

Trinity Bells – This ensemble is created for **adults who have no bell ringing experience**, but are looking for an ensemble to expand the musical skills and meet new people. We are a teaching choir. After a 3-year COVID break we are back this Fall. Bell ringing is a tremendous brain training activity to use new parts of our minds. We will rehearse one day a week during the day as determined by the participants.

Wednesday Worship Band

Ben Richter will once again lead the Wednesday Worship in a more contemporary shorter worship service each week. Ben is always looking for more singers and instrumentalists to join the Wednesday Worship.

Instrumentalists

Trinity is always looking for Instrumentalists to add to our worship music. **Pianists, Guitarist, Flute, Trumpets, Strings, etc.** There are always opportunities for special solo or ensemble music, and adding to accompany one our other ensembles. We also have the **Trinity Orchestra** for more advanced players, or the **Christmas Thunder Band** in December.

as yet by faith: a step forward

In Paul's 2nd letter to the church at Corinth, he describes what it is to be a people who live by faith. To live in this way is to recognize the temporary nature of all we have and all we see in this earthly life, and yet not lose heart. Why? Because while we and all we have will eventually pass away, what God has placed within us is constantly being renewed. As such, our home is not here. God is preparing an eternal place for us that is "beyond all measure." It's why we pray with confidence as we celebrate the life of a saint gone before us, "Grant to us who are still in our pilgrimage, and who walk as yet by faith, that, where this world groans in grief and pain, your Holy Spirit may lead us to bear witness to your light and life."

For 91 years and counting, Trinity Lutheran Church has been a community of disciples committed to walking by faith. We love our church and our building, but the rich history of Trinity has always been inclined toward what cannot be seen - relationships with God and with one another. In that way, we've come this far by faith, and now we're ready to take another step forward in our life together.

We remain committed to our mission as a congregation, to welcome all to worship joyfully, grow in faith, and serve near and far, in Jesus' name. This roots us to our past while sending us ahead, as God's Spirit leads us toward what we are becoming.

Thank you to all who participated in a Feasibility Study for a comprehensive campaign to support the life and ministry of Trinity. A total of 35 interviews with 49 people provided input for the study. The interviews were conducted at Trinity, as well as over Zoom and by phone. We are grateful to all who agreed to participate and share their responses. This is an initial important step in forming a comprehensive campaign that includes:

- annual ministry support for 2024
- 3-year capital campaign
 - To care for our church building
 - Manage and/or eliminate mortgage debt
 - Reimagine use of some of our current spaces for new ministry possibilities
 - Grow our partnerships with our neighbors and community
- legacy gift planning

to continue Trinity's ministry for future generations



A more detailed report has been presented to the Church Council, and to those who participated in the study. Copies of the report are available on request from the church office. We continue to welcome further input and feedback on the report or proposed campaign focus areas as research and conversation continue to happen.

seeds of hope

Since 2012, Trinity members have been supporting students in El Salvador through an educational sponsorship program, *Seeds of Hope*, led by **Family of Christ Lutheran Church** in Chanhassen.

Since our first trip to El Salvador in 2011, we wanted to be involved in a program that built relationships and helped others achieve sustainability. Trinity members have supported numerous students over the years, with some students completing Grade school (9th grade), while others continued to High School and some on to Technical or University level. Parents and students have expressed their gratitude time and again for having their kids being provided with this opportunity of an education. Currently, Trinity members are sponsoring 52 students in the program with 13 at the technical/university level. In El Salvador, only about 5% of the youth continue at this level.

One of our sponsors, **Sue and Mark Strobel** share their experience as a Seeds of Hope sponsor.

"In around 2015, we made the decision to

sponsor a student from El Salvador. We were matched with Karla when she was in what would be equivalent to our middle school. Over the past 8+ years, it has been a joy to support Karla's journey. We've maintained contact by sending holiday cards with heartfelt letters and photos, and we've also communicated 2-3 times a month through Facebook Messenger. Karla has faced various challenges on her educational path, including social and economic obstacles. She had to take part of a semester off from university when she gave birth to her beautiful daughter, Ashley. Despite the difficulties, she resumed her studies at the start of the pandemic, using her iPhone to complete all her coursework since she lacked access to a computer. We couldn't be prouder of her accomplishments, and we're thrilled to share that she'll be graduating with a degree in Public Relations in November. She aspires to work in the media field. Having Karla in our lives for these past 8+ years has been incredibly rewarding, and witnessing her growth and success in achieving her University graduation is truly a blessing."

Another member, **Bev Ebbecke**, has been sponsoring two students for many years. She originally selected students at similar ages to her grandsons. Gerson is finishing up his final year at the University level studying Business. And Edith began her first year of university studies in January focused on a public accounting degree at the National University.

Bev is faithful in her letter writing to both students, encouraging them in their studies and praying for their family. *"It makes me feel good, says Bev. I'm seeing them graduate from school, they are pretty good about writing to me and I write back. Edith just got accepted to the National University. She was one of the few because so many had applied. She must be bright."*

In September, existing sponsors will be asked if they will renew their sponsorship and we will receive new students for the program being recommended by the leaders in El Salvador. Early October, we will kick off our Seeds of Hope sponsorship program for new sponsors. Might this be something you and your family might consider?
