<u>+Bishop Medardo E. Gomez</u> <u>Soto+</u> 1945-2025



Lutherans in El Salvador are mourning the loss of their Bishop Emeritus Medardo E. Gómez Soto, who was renowned throughout Latin America and beyond as a powerful advocate for peace and human rights.

"Bishop Medardo Gómez was an outstanding leader in his church, in Central America and in the wider Lutheran and ecumenical communion," said Rev. Sonia Skupch, the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) Regional Secretary for Latin America and the Caribbean. "He was a wise man, faithful to the Gospel, with a clear commitment to justice and peace, and a man who was not afraid to speak of mercy and peace in very turbulent times."

Bishop Gómez died on 27 March at the age of 79 following a long illness.

Travelers to El Salvador with Seeds of Hope and Habitat for Humanity met with Bishop Gomez as part of their itineraries. He always had a word of appreciation and encouragement to share with us.







A tribute to Bishop Gomez from our friend, Pastor Christian Chavarria, originally posted on Facebook:

"Today the heart is heavy, today the soul aches, but rest in the promises of our Lord Jesus.

I thank God for giving me the opportunity to know this great man, for all the moments we shared, for all the dreams I dreamed. I will miss my beloved Bishop immensely. Thanks to him, I am who I am today. He taught

me to love God above all else in life; he taught me humility not with words but with his example; he taught me not only to love communities but to be part of them. He taught me to dream and to achieve my dreams with God's help. He taught me gratitude. "When you are grateful, God always blesses you," he told me.

He gave me confidence in life, telling me, "You are a beloved child of God." He celebrated each of my successes and congratulated me, saying, "You will go far, don't stray from God."

Every time I went on a trip, I would ask for his blessing, and he would always say: May everything go well for you, old man, God be with you. And when I returned, the first call was to the Bishop: Hello, Bishop, I'm back. And he would reply: Good, old man, how good to have you here, welcome.

So many things learned, so many memories that life will not be long enough to thank you for..."

Farewell, dear Bishop Medardo Gomez."
